### NEW TRANSLATION (PART 9)

#### Singing Dialogues (Paul Turner) -

An effective celebration of the Mass practically demands singing. Not every culture sings the same way, and not every individual can sing well. Still, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* attaches great importance to singing whenever we gather to celebrate the Eucharist.

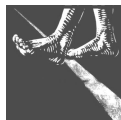
When most people think about singing at church, they imagine their favorite hymns and songs. However, the GIRM has a preference for singing something else: the dialogues. Preference should be given to those [parts] that are of greater importance and especially to those to be sung by the priest or the deacon or the lector, with the people responding, or by the priest and people together (40).

This has been part of the instructions for celebrating the Eucharist ever since 1969, with one small exception. The third edition of the *Roman Missal*, first published in 2002, added the words for the deacon or the lector. The overall intent of this sentence is to encourage the singing of dialogues throughout the Mass, and this addition suggests that even the readings could conclude with a sung dialogue: "The Word of the Lord." "Thanks be to God."

When the third edition of the missal was published both in Latin and in English, additional musical settings for chanting dialogues appeared in the books, including those in the penitential act and the ones that follow the washing of the priest's hands and the Lamb of God. There has been no change to the legislation concerning the chanting of the dialogues, but the editorial presentation of the missal is encouraging it. For this reason, you may experience not just singing hymns at the Mass but singing more dialogues of the Mass.

What crosses do we bear in order to reveal God's glory?
