WORSHIP-SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

This commission of the Parish Council initiates and coordinates those activities of the parish which foster the spiritual growth of the members, especially those pertaining to the celebration of the Liturgy of the Church. Since the celebration of the liturgy is the heart of parish activity, it would seem proper that worship be the focus of major attention of the Commission. Not to be overlooked, however, are the other dimensions of the spiritual life of the Christian, e.g., family life and personal spiritual development, ecumenical affairs, vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and evangelization. All of these areas deserve particular care if a Parish Council is to meet its obligation to itself, to its community, and to the Church.

Purpose: The purpose of the Worship-Spiritual Development Commission is to foster the spiritual life of the parish community by educating for liturgy; planning, spiritual growth; planning, implementing, and evaluating these means, e.g. parish missions, retreats, days of prayer/reflection, parish devotions, courses on prayer and spiritual growth, marriage and family, enrichment, vocation awareness, etc. Growth in faith worship, and religious commitment is a life-long task, and should be a focus of attention of the Commission. The Diocesan Liturgical Commission has been organized to assist in this task.

Membership: Among the membership of the Worship-Spiritual Development Commission should be experts or competent persons in the areas of spiritual growth, worship, and music. These persons could include one or more priests of the parish, members of the lectors, cantors, servers, organists, and choir, individuals with creative ideas for unity, family, etc. and persons involved in the various renewal movements in the Church, e.g. Cursillo, RCIA, Why Catholic?, Marriage Encounter, TEC..

Workshop for Parents

Developed by National Catholic Services, *Protecting God's Children* is a comprehensive two-and-one-half-hour program that includes two video presentations which incorporate stories from victims of sexual abuse and their families, who speak about the impact that the abuse has had on them.

In addition, the videos feature testimony from perpetrators of child abuse, who tell how they selected their victims and how they made the victims feel that the abuse was their own fault.

The program also provides information on how to prevent situations that can lead to abuse, on what behaviors should raise concern about abuse, and on how to report abuse. We are committed to provide safety for our children.

The workshops will be held on two consecutive Sundays during PSR class time in the church basement:

Part 1: Sunday, September 25 from 10:15-11:30 a.m.

Part 2: Sunday, October 2 from 10:15-11:30 a.m.

INTERESTED IN LEARNING THE CATHOLIC FAITH?

The Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is a process of faith development and growing in your relationship with God. Adults and children over the age of seven come together on a weekly basis. Sessions are informal and often center on the life stories that have brought each person to this time and place. Questions such as *What is faith?* and *Who is God?* are considered. This is the opportunity to ask questions related to things Catholic such as what are the Sacraments? What is the role of Mary in the Church?
