You can come at other times to Pray The Way of the Cross on your own. On the table in the gathering space are a variety of booklets to be used for individual prayer.

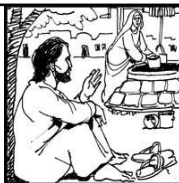
